OPENING:

- Does anyone in your group have experience working for social justice?
 Attended any protests? Worked for a nonprofit? Wrote a letter to a senator on an issue they were passionate about?
 - Talk about what activist or social justice experiences your group members have had.
- What kinds of social justice movements draw your attention?
 (Environmental sustainability, LGBTQ civil rights, etc.)
 - The staff would love to hear about these!

DISCUSSION:

If possible, ask your group members to listen to the <u>Midrash NYC</u> podcast with Brian McLaren prior to coming. Read aloud the following quotes from the podcast and discuss.

"Christian faith has defined itself for 1,400-1,500 years as a system of belief, and I think we need to rediscover, in a migration, Christian faith as a way of life... This isn't news to anyone, but would be news if we put it into practice. At the core of the way of life is love."

- What would our institutions (our churches, our families, etc.) look like if we treated Christianity as a way of life?
- How would it alter the decisions we made outside of church on Sunday if we treated Christianity as a way of life, rooted in love?
- Would you have to make changes to how you view or treat Christianity or your own Christian-ness in relation to other areas of your life (work, friendships, etc.)?

"We have presented ourselves as an **organized** religion. We need to come to see ourselves as an **organizing** religion. Meaning that we are constantly organizing people to do the work of God in the world. Rather than an organization that is just an institution trying to preserve the past. [We need] to learn what it means to have a history like we have in this country and in our world and now to say what would it look like if God's kingdom come in this world, in relation to ____?"
